The Best Part

What part of quilting do you like the best? Do you always pick the fabric first and then match it to a great pattern? Or do you start with a great pattern and then collect the fabric it needs? Do you accumulate lots of great focus fabric, and give yourself plenty of time to bond with it, before it becomes the next great project? Or perhaps just seeing a wonderful block design will start your quest for the perfect fabrics to bring it to life.

What happens when you first cut into that wonderful fabric, and start to see just how great that block is going to look? This, too, can be one of the best parts of making a quilt. The block takes shape, and the piecing is absolutely perfect—wow, this is so much fun! Even cleaning up the snibbles doesn't bother you, as the blocks start stacking up.

Then comes the laying out of the blocks. Do you have all of them done already? Or did you have to take a break from your sewing and lay some out, just to see how this future quilt is going to look? Did you make the blocks all the same or did you prefer a scrappy mix? Either way, it's still fun to get a sneak peek as to what the quilt is going to look like, done up in your colors!

Does the quilt need to be bigger? Do you make more blocks, or just add cornerstones and sashing? Maybe it needs another border? Making some new decisions and subtle changes are maybe the best part, as you start sewing the rows together. The quilt is really taking shape—and it won't be long before it's ready to be quilted. So, you start thinking of how you want to quilt it. What design? What intensity? Are you challenging yourself to make those quilting stitches absolutely perfect? Yes, maybe quilting the quilt is the best part for you!

Almost done! For many folks, the very best part of making a quilt is doing the binding! This usually means the quilt is only hours away from being finished. And that is a very good thing! Those quiet hours spent stitching down the binding can also stimulate the brain. You might find yourself reflecting on what worked really well or what needs to be changed, as you anticipate your next project. But, as long as you have that needle out, why not add a hanging sleeve to this quilt? That way you can enter it into the quilt show. It might even win a ribbon! And that could truly become the very best part!
