Check all that apply:

- You subscribe to two or more fabric related magazines. (Yes, quilting magazines count.)
- ____Every bed in the house has fabric stored underneath it.
- You tell the salespeople at the fabric store to mind their own business when they ask you what you are planning to make with your fabric purchase.
