For November 2015, please bring 12 YELLOW BATIK 6" squares in a large zip lock bag with your name written on it. They should be good quality 100% BATIK cotton, smoke free quilt fabric that is prewashed and pressed. If you miss a meeting, please send your squares with a friend if possible. Or call me to drop them off ahead of time at my home.

The next Swap session goes from January 2016 to June 2016. What is a Swap session? Each month you bring 6-inch squares of a specific design and/or color to the guild meeting. The number of these squares is determined by how many members sign up. (Usually around 12) In exchange you will receive other members 6-inch squares. It's a great way to build up a variety of similar colors to use in your quilts! Sign up sheets will be available at the Oct and Nov meetings.

For the 2016 January-June session, we will swap fabrics that are "I Spy" with my little eye! If you have a favorite child or would like to donate a kid's quilt, these are the squares for you!! If you still have a kit of quilt blocks or developmental hearts patterns, remember to sew these when you can and return them to me. Thank you, as always, for the many items you have already sewn.




