I put each separate size into zip lock bags so that when I'm ready to make a scrappy project, all I have to do is cut the length I need. Well, looking forward to seeing you at the March meeting. Stitches of Love



2016 End of Year Report: The Dubuque Stitches of Love project, which began in 2004, is proud to have completed its 13th year of service to the Tri-State community. The mission of Stitches of Love is to make adult-sized headwear, free of charge, for local cancer patients and to distribute them through two treatment centers: Dubuque Internal Medicine, Oncology Department, 1515 Delhi, Dubuque IA and Medical Associates-East Campus, Oncology/Hematology Department, 1000 Langworthy St, Dubuque IA.

From 2004 to 2016 we made and donated 3665 hats. In 2016, we donated 376 hats with the time and talent of 12+volunteers plus our CCQG Community Service Projects volunteers. These 376 items were lovingly made with over 1120.5 hours of volunteer time. The total hats donated included: 87 hand-knit, 106 hand-crochet, 5 knit/fleece pillbox, and 178 kerchiefs. We used the following volunteer number of hours to make the hats: hand knit (3), hand crochet (3), pillbox (1.5), and kerchief (3). These times include any laundering, ironing, transportation, etc.

Our donated hats were made by individuals that worked in the comfort of their own homes and/or as part of a group. Groups that participated in 2016 included Cable Car Quilters Guild (CCQG), Dubuque IA. The CCQG Community Service Projects volunteers made 120 kerchief chemo hats during two different workdays at Shalom.

Stitches of Love revenue primarily comes from personal donations. The American Cancer Society donated leftover Relay for Life t-shirts and they are recycled into kerchiefs and pillbox hats. We also received miscellaneous individual donations of fabric, yarn, and batting from current and past CCQG members and community volunteers.

Finally, a big **Thank You** goes to you for supporting this most worthwhile cause.
